Through our key texts, we learn about different cultural and religious beliefs. We also look at how migration affects the meaning of home and belonging. We use these literacy studies to launch our historical study of the Vikings and their life, believes and customs.	Through our key text, Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, we embark on a journey about chocolate. We learn about the history of chocolate, its impact on society (past and present) and its current use including fair trade.
