Communication and Language

Children will predict and share experiences through:

- listening to stories
- joining in with repeated refrains
- follow simple directions
- understands the use of objects
- shows understanding of preposition
- understand 'why' and 'how' questions

Physical Development

Children will be able to experiment moving in different ways and using objects

- slithering, rolling, crawling, walking, running jumping,
- mount stairs, steps, or climbing frame
- catch large ball
- use one-handed tools and equipment
- hold pencil between thumb and two fingers
- copy some letters

Personal Social and Emotional Development

Children will

- play in a group, extending and elaborating play ideas
- keep play going by responding to what others has to say
- demonstrate friendly behaviour towards peers and adults
- select and use activities and resources with help
- enjoy responsibilities of carrying out small task
- communicate freely about own home and community
- aware of own feelings, and knows that some actions and words will hurt others'

Understanding of the World

Children will investigate people, communities and the world through:

- trips to local area
- talk about significant events in their own life
- compare photographs of family and friends
- describe special times or events of family and friends
- show interest in different occupations
- comments and asks questions about their familiar world
- talk about the things they have observed

Expressive Arts and Design

Children will investigate and explore using media and materials through:

- sing familiar songs
- move rhythmically
- taps rhythms
- change sounds
- mixed colours
- drawing
- constructions

Mathematics

Children will investigate and explore numbers in different ways to develop early mathematical concept through:

- classifying
- matching
- comparing
- ordering

Literacy

Children will show interest in print and illustration and will experiment with writing:

- give meaning to marks as they draw and paint
- ascribe meaning to marks that they have seen in different places
- model writing for a purpose
- show awareness of rhymes
- listen and join in with stories
- look at books independently

ICT

Children will explore operating simple equipment such as

- CD
- technological toys with knobs and pulleys, real objects, cameras and phones
- computers
