## Anti Bullying Strategy

ometimes we get confused about the difference between conflict (disagreements) and bullying:

- Bullying is NOT one-off incidents where someone is mean or unkind to another person
- Bullying is NOT when someone accidentally hurts another person
- We all have disagreements or arguments with others at times and this is normal but is NOT bullying
- Someone choosing not to play with you and playing with others is NOT bullying
- Sometimes mean things are said but this is NOT bullying
- Bullying is when someone harms or hurts another person over and over aaain

This week, we celebrate with our Jewish community, the holiday of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

Rosh Hashanah is a two-day Jewish holiday which marks the beginning of the Jewish year. This year it will be on 25<sup>th</sup> September. Rosh Hashanah (Hebrew: אוֹשׁנָה), literally meaning the "head [of] the year"

Yom Kippur is the holiest day of the year for Jews, it comes on the heels of Rosh Hashanah. It is a time of praying in the synagogue, fasting, personal reflection, and hearing the shofar. Yom Kippur means Day of Atonement.
